To advocate on behalf of all veterans." We do this by providing assistance for claims and benefits, advocacy for legislative priorities and community service.

Commanders and Chairmen, please encourage all your members to sign up for the VFW Action Corps Weekly. To sign up go to VFW.org- Advocacy-Grass Roots. The VFW Action Corps Weekly, is an easy-to-read electronic newsletter that highlights the VFW's advocacy efforts on Capitol Hill. The VFW Action Corps is what gives the VFW its strength in advocating for our nation's heroes. Working handin-hand with the VFW's National Legislative Service -- whose office is in eye-shot of the Capitol dome in Washington -- members of the VFW Action Corps are armed with all of the tools and information they need to help the VFW in its mission to support our nation's veterans.

It is predicted at the current rate of loss the VFW membership will drop below 1 million in the next 4 years. In order to be a strong advocate for Veterans we cannot let this happen. I would like to ask each Post and Auxiliary to look at "How can we be more successful in recruiting new members and reinstating members that we have lost? What can we do to make our VFW Post and Auxiliary more successful?"

Some of the things you may consider are: Familiarize yourself with each other's programs. Communicate with each other and work together. Have membership applications for both the post and the auxiliary with you when you are out in the community. Do not miss the opportunity to recruit a new post or auxiliary member. Start now advertising the youth essay programs. The new forms are available at both the national and state web sites at vfw.org and vfwwa.org.

When you have a table during buddy poppies or membership recruiting drives stand to the side of the table and have interesting items (pictures of members/others during time in service, map to show where they have served, helmets, military ball caps, etc.), posters, and materials to bring people to your table. Be prepared to sell the VFW. Give reasons why someone should join your post or auxiliary.

Together we can build our Posts and Auxiliaries and continue to be the organization that supports and advocates for Veterans, Military and their Families.
