General Order Number 4 September 2025

Attention all members, Pursuant to Section 901 of the National Bylaws, "Discipline of Members," any member who commits offenses recognized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may be subject to disciplinary action. Acts of sexual harassment, racial or sexual discrimination, or any other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline or deemed unbecoming of a member will not be tolerated. Harassment and discrimination include any verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe or pervasive to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment, or that otherwise interferes with another's ability to participate in VFW activities. All members are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, respect, professionalism, and common courtesy at all times.
